David I. Cleland is Professor Emeritus in the School of Engineering at the University of Pittsburgh. He is the author/editor of thirty-four books in the fields of Project Management, Engineering Management, and Manufacturing Management. An active member of the Project Management Institute (PMI), he has published numerous articles, handbook chapters, and presented many papers on project management and leadership at professional meetings in his field. He has served as a consultant for both national and foreign companies and is recognized as one of the best-known members of PMI. He has been described as the "Father of Project Management" by PMI.

Dr. Cleland has both a national and international reputation in his field and has been honored for his original and continuing contributions to his discipline. He is a third time recipient of the "Distinguished Contribution to Project Management Award" from the PMI. In 1987, he was elected a Fellow of PMI. He is co-founder and co-director of the University of Pittsburgh Manufacturing Assistance Center (MAC), whose mission is to provide manufacturing systems technology assistance to small and mid-sized manufacturers in Western Pennsylvania. Dr. Cleland prior to entering academia had a distinguished career in the USAF. In 1997, he was honored with the establishment of the "David I. Cleland Excellence in Project Management Literature Award" sponsored by the PMI.
